211 callers will be referred to *Santa Fe CONNECT* when they need resources. Whether someone needs help for basic needs such as shelter or food, mental health support, senior services or a family crises, 211 is there to help. We provide free referrals to health and human services, government agencies, and community-based organizations.



This statewide service operates two locations in Santa Fe for those who qualify for free tax preparation. For those who earn \$57,000 or less, or for senior citizens, tax preparation can return tax refunds and credits for those who are owed them.

GRANTMAKING

United Way of North Central New Mexico is the largest nonprofit funder in the state. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, our grant process provided \$3.3 million to support 80 nonprofit programs in four counties in 2021-2022.
