Education

- Improve Pre-K through 12th grade school attendance measures through programming that emphasizes the importance of graduating from high school
- Increase College & Career readiness through work-based learning experiences for high school, GED, and college students
- Increase post-high school skill building and degree/certificate attainment for young adults

Housing Stability

Increasing access to affordable housing, including permanent supportive or transitional housing

Safety and Well-Being/Health

- □ Improving community safety measures
- □ Increasing access to equitable health-related services

Basic Needs

- Hunger relief services; both pantry and prepared meal services

Trust Based Philanthropy Progress

- Impact and Basic Needs grants awarded as general operating dollars
 - Capacity Building grants remain project specific
 - Multi-year Impact grants (3 years)
- Shorter, more streamlined processes
 - Grant application focus on overall agency goals and outcomes
 - Financial Standards Review only required for selected agencies
 - Verbal grant reporting option
- Support beyond the check
 - Marketing
 - Capacity resources



Grants Process and Timeline

Phase 1: Grant Application	January 29 th March 8 th at 4:00 pm	Grant applications open Due Date: Completed Grants application
Phase 2: Application Review	April	UWNCNM staff and Grant Panels review and score applications. Grant panels are made up of Community Investment Council, donors, volunteers, and members of the community connected to services provided. Panels will engage with agencies during review to follow up on any questions about the application.
Phase 3: Allocations	Мау	Community Investment Council recommends grant awards. Using the scoring from Grant Review Panels, the Community Investment Council makes final allocation recommendations to the UWNCNM Board of Directors. In Santa Fe, the Santa Fe Advisory Council will review panel scores and make recommendations.
	June 11 th	UWNCNM Board approves allocations, pending successful completion of FSR.
Phase 4: Financial Standards Review (FSR)	Week of June 12 th	Agencies selected to receive an award are notified and complete the Financial Standards Review (FSR) process. Award is dependent on successful completion of the FSR. Agencies not selected for award will also be notified at this time.
Phase 5: Award	July	Grant payments begin July 2024.
