Girl Scouts of New Mexico Trails

The Girl Scouts of New Mexico Trails have achieved remarkable success through the Every Girl Initiative (EGI), supported by the United Way of North Central New Mexico. EGI has partnered with over 24 Title 1 schools to offer free after-school programs, benefiting more than 480 girls with skills and mentorship in STEM, Outdoor Leadership, Entrepreneurship, and Life Skills. Girl Scout alumnae, including those with only 2-3 years of participation, excel beyond non-alumnae in education and life success. This initiative provides transformative opportunities to every girl in New Mexico, regardless of financial background.

Saranam

Saranam is excited to welcome families to the new ADC Family campus on Albuquerque's west side, which will double capacity with 25 additional homes, classrooms, office space, playgrounds, gathering spaces, a renovated family center, community gardens, and parking. Celebrating 20 years of service, Saranam's mission is to end homelessness and poverty through housing, education, and supportive communities, transforming the lives of over 172 families, 197 adults, and 363 children.

Umoja ABQ

Umoja ABQ is an organization working on empowering refugee women in Albuquerque. Kiza, an outstanding Umoja client, arrived in September 2023 and enrolled in Umoja ABQ's ESL and Drivers Manual classes. As her confidence grew, she qualified for Level 4 English at CNM. In addition to taking classes at CNM, Kiza passed the knowledge exam to obtain her Learner's Permit and has signed up for professional driving lessons. A single mother working full-time, Kiza still finds time to extend her knowledge, skills, and opportunities through classes at Umoja ABQ, with a long-term goal of becoming a nurse.
