# **WHAT A DOLLAR PROVIDES 2024**

Unite with **United Way of North Central New Mexico** to ensure every person has an equal chance for a bright future. Donations make a real difference for individuals, children and families in our five-county community.



### What does \$5 a day **(\$1,825)** provide?

Support updates to the 211 Helpline database to provide callers in need with resources in housing, utilities and food.



#### What does \$10 a week (\$520) provide?

Allows the Family Advocacy Center (FAC) to provide a week's worth of hotel vouchers for two families to leave violent homes.



### What does \$15 a paycheck (\$390) provide?

Sponsors 80 students to participate in career/college readiness activities: resume writing workshops, mock interviews and career fairs.



### What does \$5 a paycheck (\$130) provide?

Underwrites incentives for 26 students who are rewarded for improved school attendance, making them more likely to graduate high school.

## **UWNCNM Community Priorities**

### **UWNCNM Direct Services**

- 211 is an information and referral helpline that connects callers with human services in the five-county area UWNCNM serves as well as Catron, Cibola, McKinley and Socorro counties.
- Tax Help New Mexico offers free tax preparation services to New Mexico households with an annual income of \$65,000 or less or those who are 65 years or older.
- The Family Advocacy Center (FAC) provides victims of sexual assault and interpersonal violence with integrated support services under one roof, reducing trauma and stress for clients.
- Ride United provides free transportation in Santa Fe County for people to get to critical appointments, such as doctor's appointments or a job interview.

## **RESILIENT** COMMUNITIES

In a new initiative in Santa Fe and Valencia Counties, United Way is partnering with local organizations that seek to improve community self-reliance. An investment totaling \$2.375 million over three years in these two counties will allow the partner agencies to focus on systems change to increase economic autonomy.




